

The Second Sunday in Lent March 5, 2023

Today's Readings: Genesis 1-4; Psalm 33:4-22; 2 Timothy 1:8-10; Matthew 17:1-9.

Every Year we celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus on the 2nd Sunday of Advent. If we place ourselves on that high mountain, we might notice new details that draw us into a deeper meaning. There are three details for contemplation. First, whenever Jesus retreats to a mountain or quiet place, He seeks prayer time with His Father. Second, This particular prayer time results in a *theophany*, an intense manifestation of God in visible form. Jesus reveals His full divinity to Peter, James and John and to us as well through the written scripture. Lastly, God the Father speaks words of confirmation, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him". Lent gives us the opportunity to spend more time with God in prayer. His invitation will not disappoint because prayer never leaves us unchanged. When we make space and time for prayer, we give God the opportunity to speak the words we most need to hear. Take time to listen to God's message of love to you.

This Week at Home

Monday, March 6—Daniel 9:4-10; Psalm 79:8-13; Luke 6:36-38. Today's gospel message from Jesus is a signpost. Be compassionate, avoid judgment, shun condemnation, offer pardon and give generously. Write these down on cards and put them around your house to see them as signposts from Jesus.

Tuesday, March 7—Isaiah 1:10-20; Psalm 50:8-23; Matthew 23:1-12. Today's gospel tells us to live with integrity. Integrity means that there is agreement between who we say we are and what we do. Speak with authenticity, strive for sincerity and embrace the virtue of integrity as the doorway to holiness.

Wednesday, March 8—Jeremiah 18:18-20; Psalm 31:5-16; Matthew 20:17-28. Jesus reminds us to resist the temptation to be the first served. He instructs us to cultivate humility through practicing service over prestige. Do one act of humble service anonymously today.

Thursday, March 9—Jeremiah 17:5-10; Psalm 1:1-6; Luke 16:19-31. Today we are reminded to keep our eyes fixed on the Lord. The contrast between the rich man who trusted in human beings and those who trust in the Lord reveal the consequences of our choices. How might we raise the visibility of those in need and reach out with hope in the Lord?

Friday, March 10—Genesis 37:3-28; Psalm 105:16-21; Matthew 21:33-46. The quickest way to veer off the path of holiness is to bury our conscience. When we tune out the Holy Spirit we can easily be led to destructive choices. Today we are asked to examine our conscience and check in to who are the primary voices we are listening to in our day to day lives.

Saturday, March 11—Micah 7:14-20; Psalm 103: 1-12; Luke 15:1-3,11-32. Today's parable about the forgiving father reminds us that God steadfastly stands waiting for us with open arms and infinite forgiveness. Through our warm smiles, kind gestures, and hospitable spirit we can communicate the invitation to return to our compassionate God and reconcile with the community of faith.
