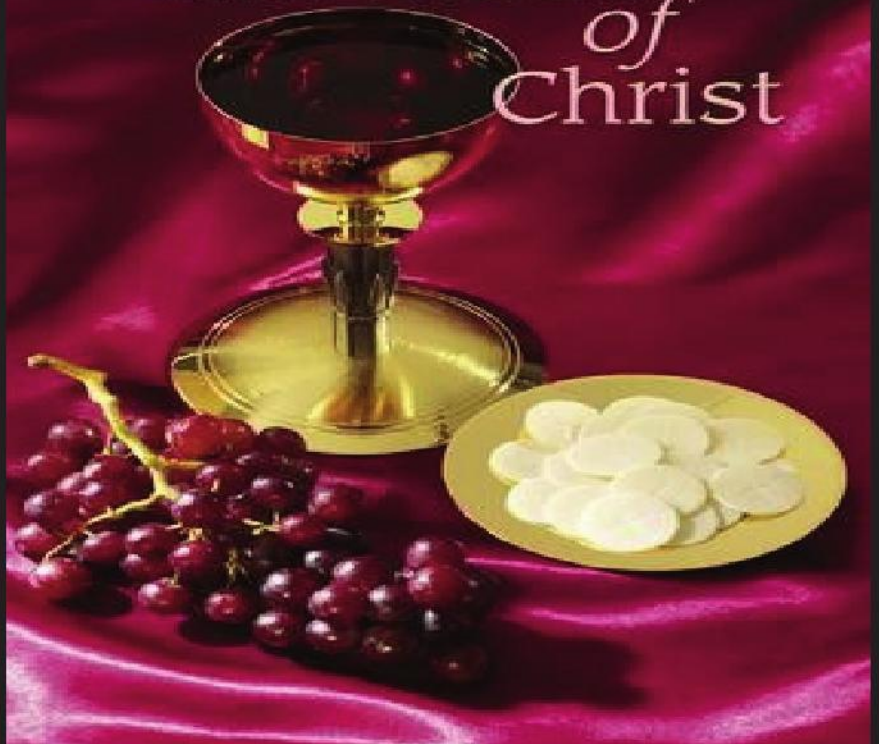

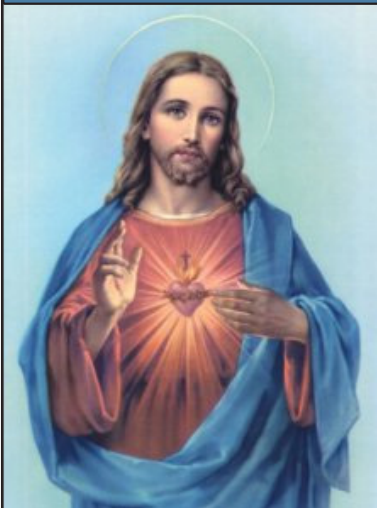

MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus dates back to the time of the Apostles.

Some depictions present the Sacred Heart alone, while others show Jesus with His Sacred Heart radiant in His chest.

In this image, we can see various small emblems, each representing an aspect of Christ's sacrificial love.

The first thing we notice is that Jesus' heart is exposed, for He has poured Himself out for us and desires that we enter into His Most Loving Heart.

The crown surrounding the Sacred Heart recalls Jesus being crowned with thorns, and reminds us that He endured persecution and ridicule for us.

The fire represents the burning flame of divine love and the essence of divinity. The Sacred Heart is on fire with love for mankind.

A crown rests on top of the Sacred Heart because the crown is a symbol of Jesus' kingship. The lance-wound references John 19:33-37, when the Roman soldiers pierced Jesus' side and blood and water flowed from the wound, which, according to the Gospel of John, "took place that the scripture might be fulfilled, 'Not a bone of him shall be broken'" (John 19:36).

This image of blood and water is highly symbolic. It represents the Passover Lamb sacrificed for our sins to save us from death and reminds us that Jesus shed every last drop of His blood for our sake.

Now, when you honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus today, you can meditate on its profound symbolism and on Christ's burning love for you.

IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



Even though the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was instituted for the universal Church relatively recently (1944), this devotion has a long history in the Church, going back to Scripture itself.

We read about the Heart of Our Lady *three times* in the Gospels. All three instances are contained in the second chapter of

Luke, which, of the four Gospels, gives us the most detail about Our Lady and the early life of Our Lord.

The first reference is in Luke's narrative of Our Lord's Nativity. The Evangelist speaks of the adoration of the shepherds and their marvelous testimony of the angelic message they had received (Luke 2:18-19).

We hear similar language further on, after Our Lady and St. Joseph find the Child Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:51). These simple statements from St. Luke offer us deep insight into Our Lady's interior life and her continual spirit of contemplation.

The final passage we'll examine describes the prophecy of Simeon when the Holy Family comes to the Temple to present Jesus to His Father forty days after His birth. (Luke 2:34-35).

In this passage we can see the basis for the traditional depiction of Our Lady's Immaculate Heart, with the sword piercing it.

Both the prophecy of Simeon and the Crucifixion—where this prophecy was most fully realized, where this sword was at its sharpest and most painful—are counted among Our Lady's Seven Sorrows.

A host of sacramental statistics: Vatican tracks practice of the faith

The Vatican has an office dedicated to collecting statistics from every diocese around the world; the numbers are compiled into a yearbook and include a look at Catholic sacramental practice around the globe. [by Cindy Wooden, CATHOLIC NEWS SERVICE, June 2, 2023]

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- As first Communion season winds down and wedding fever rises, Catholic counters are busy. The Central Office of Church Statistics, a department of the Vatican Secretariat of State, keeps track of baptisms, first Communions, confirmations and Catholic marriages reported by dioceses around the world.

The statistics are one way of "showing adherence to the church," including the continuing practice of the faith over time, said the introduction to the chapter "Practice of Religion" in the 512-page volume, *Statistical Yearbook of the Church 2021*. Using statistics reported as of Dec. 31, 2021, the book was published in February this year. It counted more than 1.3 billion Catholics in the world or 17.7% of the global population.

Dioceses and other church territories around the world reported more than 13.7 million baptisms in 2021 and more than 11.1 million of those, 81%, were baptisms of children under the age of 7. The yearbook for 1991 reported 18.1 million baptisms worldwide, 89% of which involved welcoming into the church children under the age of 7. The statistical yearbook noted "a general downward trend in the relative number of baptisms, following closely the trend in the birthrate in most countries."

The yearbook also provided a look at the percentage of baptisms of people over the age of 7 by continent from 2016 to 2021, providing an indication that missionary activity is holding steady everywhere but the Middle East. Africa leads the world in the percentage of baptisms in which the new Christian was over 7 years of age. In 2016 close to 33% of the baptisms on the continent involved older children and adults; by 2021, it had grown to 36%. Both the Middle East and Europe reported in 2016 that about 4.5% of all baptisms involved people over the age of 7; by 2021, the Middle East reported only 2.9% of baptisms involved that population, while Europe stood steady at 4.5%. North American dioceses reported 8.7% in 2016 and 8.6% in 2021.

The number of Catholic weddings celebrated around the world in 2021 was over 1.8 million; of those, only 9.2% involved a Catholic marrying a non-Catholic. On the low end, only 1.7% of marriages in Central America were between a Catholic and a non-Catholic, while in Oceania the figure was 28.3%. North America was close with 20.2 percent of all sacramental marriages involving a Catholic and a non-Catholic. The yearbook for 1991 reported more than 3.8 million Catholic weddings with 8.9% of them involving a Catholic marrying a non-Catholic. In 2021, the yearbook said, 8.5 million people received their first Communion, and 7.3 million people were confirmed.

In addition to listing the number of first Communions and confirmations reported country by country and continent by continent, the 2021 yearbook also gives the number of those sacraments per 1,000 Catholics in the country or region, giving a sense of how many children those Catholics are having and how they are or are not bringing their children up in the faith.

The global average was 6.2 first Communions for every 1,000 Catholics; in Asia the ratio was highest at 9.1, while the Americas were on the low end with 5.2. The yearbook said there were 7.3 first Communions per 1,000 Catholics in the United States in 2021 and 3.1 first Communions for every 1,000 Catholics in Canada.

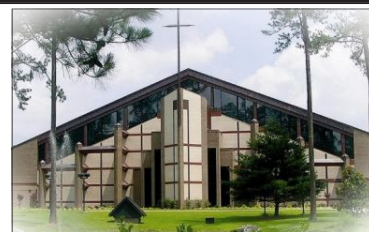

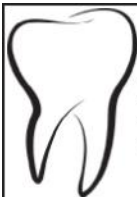
