# SAINT OF THE WEEK

## SAINT JOSEPH THE WORKER



St Joseph has two feast days on the liturgical calendar. The first is March 19th - Joseph, the Husband of Mary. The second is May 1st - Joseph, the Worker.

Beginning in the *Book of Genesis*, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in *Genesis* to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work.

There is very little about the life of Joseph in Scripture but still, we know that he was the chaste husband of Mary, the foster father of Jesus, a carpenter and a man who was not wealthy. We also know that he came from the royal lineage of King David.

He lived in the small village of Nazareth and served as the town carpenter. He seems to have been well known in his home community, for when Jesus returned to Nazareth, he was known as Joseph's son.


Joseph's role as a foster father, as we can imagine, was not easy, either. His worry and anxiety over the child's birthplace, and then, the threat on his life, must have weighed heavily on Joseph's heart. And missing the child when he stayed behind in Jerusalem at the age of 12 caused both Mary and Joseph to worry.

We can see from his actions in scripture that Joseph was a compassionate man and obedient to the will of God. He also loved Mary and Jesus and wanted to protect and provide for them.

Since Joseph does not appear in Jesus' public life, at his death, or resurrection, many historians believe Joseph had probably died before Jesus entered public ministry. (John 19:26-27). It must have been a hard and sad day when Mary and Jesus had to face the death of their beloved husband and father.

And just as Jesus gave us His mother to be our mother as He hung dying on the cross, so the Church has declared Joseph the patron saint of the universal Church to watch over it and guide it as he did the Christ child so many centuries ago.

### CINCO DE MAYO: SAY "OLE!" AND CELEBRATE MEXICAN CULTURE

Thursday, May 5th, is Cinco de Mayo! For one day, Mexican culture resonates around the world. Ironically, this global recognition of the Mexican nation didn't start in Mexico; it started in the United States.

Spanish for *the fifth of May*, Cinco de Mayo recalls the Mexican victory at the Battle of Puebla in 1862. In a true underdog story, Mexico was exhausted and in debt from years of fighting when its poorly equipped, outnumbered militia took on the well-outfitted, larger French army that hadn't been defeated in decades—and won.

Though the win was fairly short-lived, it nonetheless gave Mexico's army and people a much-needed sense of national pride that is still remembered today. Since the first local Cinco de Mayo parties were hosted by Mexicans mining in California, the holiday has expanded internationally.

Today, across the United States, Canada, the Caribbean, Australia, New Zealand, England and France, Cinco de Mayo is an occasion to revel in Mexican food, culture, dance and music.

## Ross Williams, Seminarian at Saint Paul, ordained to transitional diaconate with classmate Cong Le.

Cong Le and Ross Williams, seminarians for the Diocese of Raleigh, were ordained to the transitional diaconate Saturday, April 15 at Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral. Bishop Luis Rafael Zarama conferred the rite during Mass. Deacon Williams, 27, was born in Wisconsin. As a boy, he moved to Cary, North Carolina in 2000 and St. Michael the Archangel became the home parish for him and his family. He graduated from NC State University, where he studied computer engineering, before he began studies at seminary.

Each deacon asked someone to assist with vesting, or process of investiture. Deacon Ross was assisted by Deacon Brian Phillips from his home parish of St. Michael. "I deeply respect him," said Deacon Ross. "One of the interesting things, you can be vested by a deacon or a priest ... I thought it was important to be vested by a deacon because that is the order that I am joining. That is the point that I am reaching. Next year, God-willing, and I am going to keep on saying that ... I will ask a priest to vest me. But, here, I am becoming a deacon." Deacon Ross said he feels support from family, friends and the Catholic community, including Infant of Prague Parish in Jacksonville, where he did his pastoral year. "I've heard it said that there are two ways of discerning the priesthood ... with St Peter he was called to be an apostle and then slowly over time figured things out. Whereas, with Paul, it was all at once. I had the Pauline style of call," he smiled. "October of my senior year of college ... it all fell into place."

Thanks be to God! May the Lord bless Deacon Ross Williams as he moves forward with preparation for his priestly Ordination. Please keep him and Deacon Cong Le in your prayers.



## Funeral Mass and Burial for Father Paul Brant, SJ will take place on Wednesday, May 3rd.

The Funeral Mass will be at Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral in Raleigh at 10am.  
Burial will be at Our Lady of Guadalupe Cemetery in Newton Grove about 1pm.

Father Paul Brant, SJ, who served for many years in the Diocese of Raleigh, died April 7. He was 82. A priest of the USA East Jesuit Province, he was retired from active priestly ministry at the time of his death in Ciudad Altamirano in Mexico. A native of Raleigh, he attended Cathedral Latin School and what's now known as NC State University. Father Brant was ordained to the priesthood May 28, 1977 at Sacred Heart [then] Cathedral. He served in many areas, including Hispanic Ministry, Campus Ministry and the Cursillo movement, which is a short course in Christian living, similar to a retreat, that promotes a deeper relationship with Christ. "Paul Brant was an extraordinary man with a vision. Through the Cursillo movement, he was saving the faith ... he was dedicated, and I did learn a lot from him, specifically to have love for missions within my own parish," said Father Marcos León Angulo, pastor of St. Bernadette Parish in Butner, who first met Father Brant in 1996. "I truly will miss him." May he rest in Peace!


