



## SAINT OF THE WEEK



#### **SAINT JOHN OF AVILA**

Born in the Castile region of Spain, John was sent at the age of 14 to the University of Salamanca to study law. He later moved to Alcala, where he studied philosophy and theology before his ordination as a diocesan priest.

After John's parents died and left him as their sole heir to a considerable fortune, he distributed his money to the poor. In 1527, he traveled to Seville, hoping to become a missionary in Mexico. The archbishop of that city persuaded him to stay and spread the faith in Andalusia. During nine years of work there, he developed a reputation as an engaging preacher, a perceptive spiritual director and a wise confessor.

Because John was not afraid to denounce vice in high places, he was investigated by the Inquisition but was cleared in 1533. He later worked in Cordoba and then in Granada, where he organized the University of Baeza, the first of several colleges run by diocesan priests who dedicated themselves to teaching and giving spiritual direction to young people.

John of Avila worked closely with members of the Society of Jesus and helped their growth within Spain and its colonies. John's mystical writings have been translated into several languages. He was beatified in 1894, canonized in 1970, and declared a doctor of the Church on October 7, 2012. franciscanmedia.org/saint-of-the-day

## Parish Survey

#### **ASCENSION SURVEY SUNDAY WEEKEND!**

"They were looking intently up into the sky as He was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand there looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen Him go into heaven" (Acts 1:10-11).

During all Masses the weekend of May 20-21<sup>st</sup>, we will be asking all adults (even if you come from the same household) and those over age 16 to participate in completing a parish survey. We want to hear from you!

We have enlisted the guidance of The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University or "CARA" to assist us with this project.

The questions for this survey, however, have been specifically selected by our Pastoral Council to assist us in planning over the next few years. It's an extremely important project for our parish as well as a wonderful opportunity for everyone to make their needs and opinions known. We want to hear from everyone!

There will be limited time made available to complete the surveys during Mass. But, if you need additional time, you can take them home, complete them and return them to church where they can be dropped in a "SURVEY" box that will be available in the atrium. In addition, we plan to make a link available which will allow you to respond via the "internet" rather than "in Pew". Either way, it's our goal to hear from as many of our parishioners as possible!

Once we receive everyone's completed surveys, they will be analyzed and submitted to CARA for compilation of a detailed report which will be made available to everyone later this summer.

A Message from David Winstead, a member of the Pastoral Council:

"Dear Parishioner, Your desires for what Saint Paul could be, or your dissatisfaction with how things are going, are of great significance. The Lord has placed them on your heart. Your delight in how Saint Paul currently functions stems from the same Source. These desires, dissatisfactions and delights ought to be expressed to the parish because God acts on them when they are made known.

Complete the survey to make them known and do something worthwhile. Stoke the Holy Spirit's fire in this church! Or, choose inactivity. But, if you do, recall Chesterton's words: "A dead thing can go with the stream, but only a living thing can go against it."
